Lausanne, 10 December 2024: The 53rd edition of the Prix de Lausanne, to be held from 2 to 9 February 2025, at Beaulieu Lausanne, will be presided over by Laurent Hilaire, Director of the Bayerisches Staatsballet and Etoile of the Paris Opera Ballet.

On the Sunday following the Finals, the 2nd edition of "Rising Stars" will take place, an exceptional performance featuring guest stars António Casalinho and Margarita Fernandes. The performance also features the winning Young Creation Award variations and an original piece from the Partner School Choreographic Project, choreographed by Jessica Lang. This 90-minute performance offers a unique opportunity to experience the best of the Prix Lausanne!

This year, the jury is composed of nine members. Each of them is either affiliated with one of our partner schools and companies, a former Prize Winner, or a renowned figure in the world of dance. The panel's composition also considers other criteria, such as geographical diversity, a balanced representation of generations and experience levels, and a plurality of dance styles.
